



Softlogic Equity Fund


FUND MANAGER CORNER

Lackluster trading at Colombo Bourse with Avurudhu Season and uncertainty with US tariff uncertainty

The benchmark All Share Price Index declined marginally to 15,800 (0.1%) and the S & P SL 20 declined 91 points (1.9%) to 4,644 for the month of April 2025. Average daily turnover increased to Rs. 2,540 mn in April. Net foreign inflow of Rs. 800 mn was reported in the month of April reversing the net outflow trend recorded in the last six months. Foreign buying was seen in counters such as Digital Mobility Solutions Lanka, Commercial Bank of Ceylon and John Keells Holdings. Top contributors to market turnover were seen in banking counters and John Keells Holdings PLC. Total market capitalisation of the Colombo Stock Exchange remains aprox at Rs. 5,667 bn.

The Fund performance was negative 2.16% during the month of April against the benchmark ASPI of negative 0.10%. Further the YTD performance (Jan to April) was negative 5.97% vs negative ASPI of 0.91%. Fund's equity exposure is at 89% end April 2025 and keeping a higher cash buffer to ride the uncertain global trends currently. We continue to hold our exposure to tourism and banking sector stocks. Global markets have been volatile given tariff negotiations with pause on US tariff increase. We remain cautiously optimistic.
